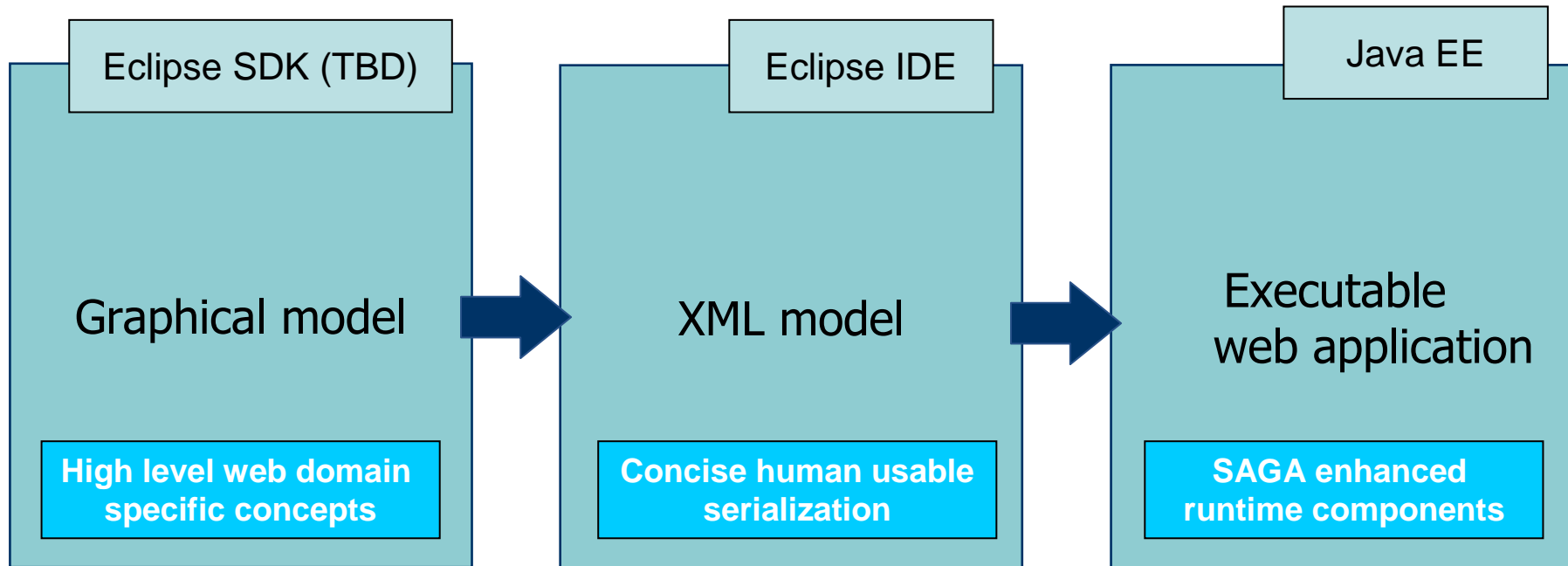

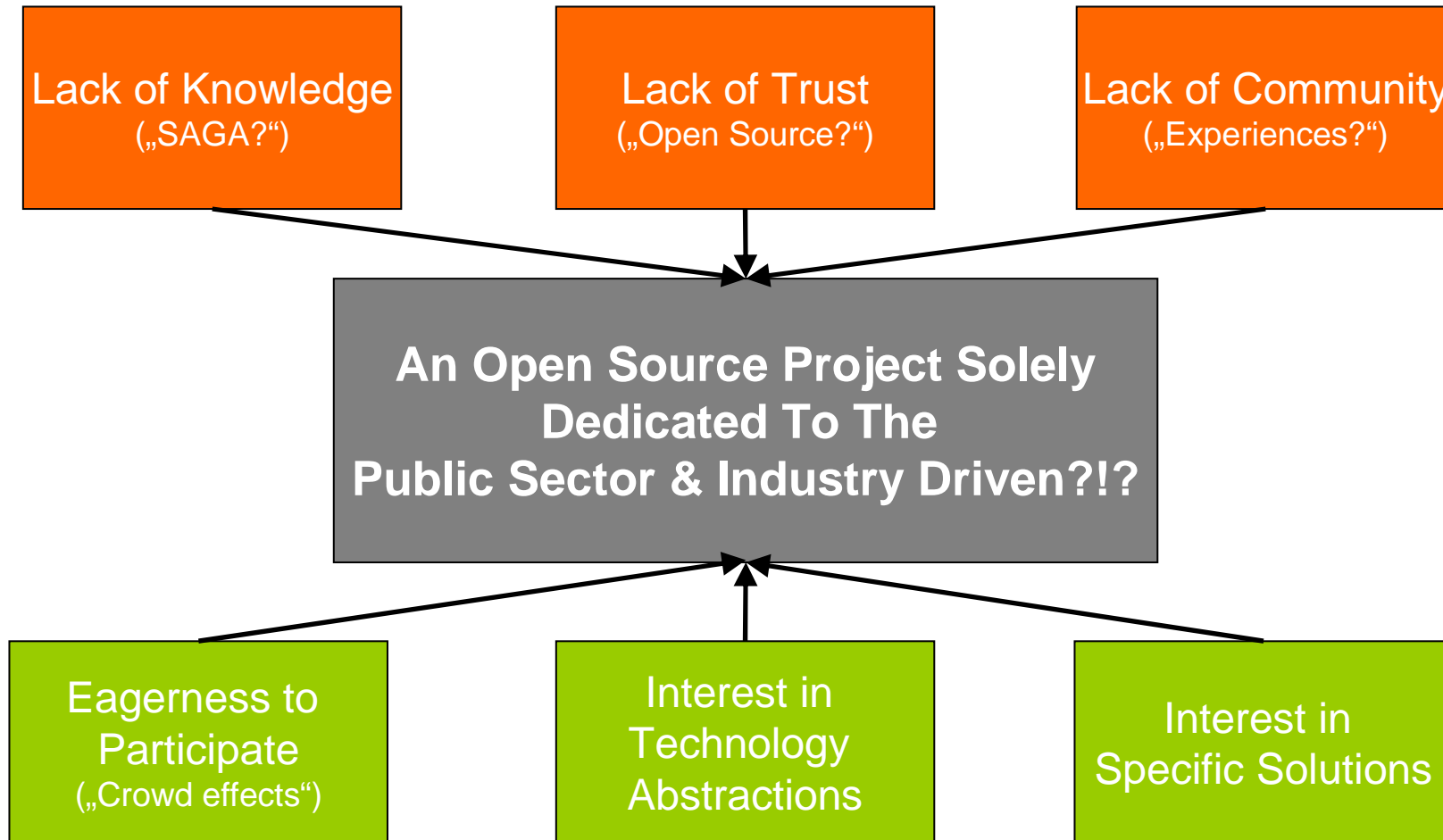

Missing Links of the Open Source EcoSphere



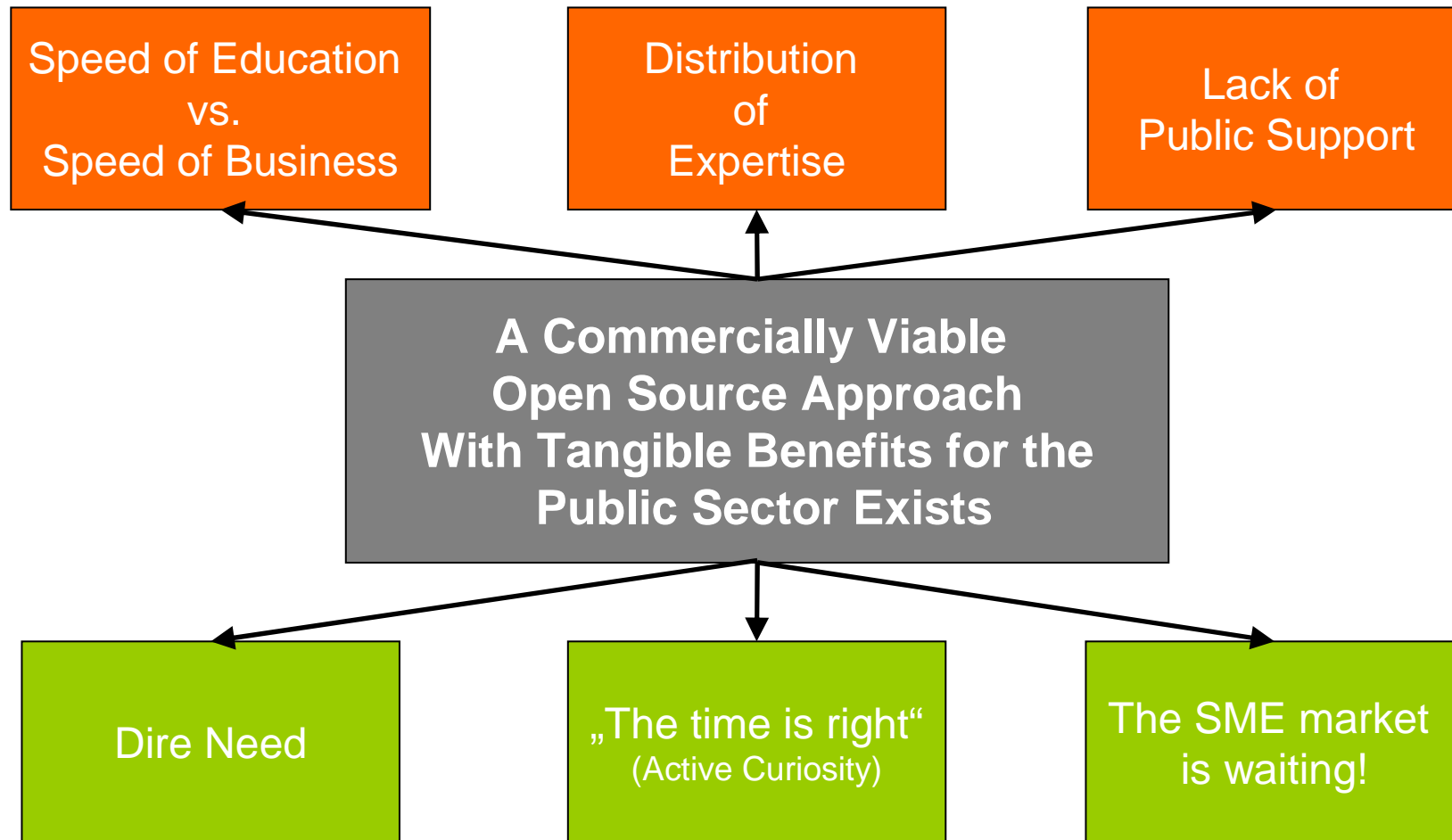
- Open source in the public sector should not be a special case of open source.
- Open source community management in the public sector is lacking a strategy.
- Open source marketing is too technical.
- Open source lobbying is too unorganized.

Missing Links of the Public Sector Ecosphere



- Public tenders fail to take into account the strengths of open source and agile approaches.
- Studies fail to take into account „crowd benefits“.
- The success factors of industrial open source do not count as much in the public sector:
 - being the first or best solution for a technical problem
 - being freely availableThinking often centers around career protection.
