Dimension Context & Principles

Context	Luxembourg's National Interoperability Framework is less formal as it is usually in greater EU countries. Interoperability is under the control and responsibility of "Ministère de la Fonction publique et de la Réforme administrative" and "Centre des technologies de l'Information de l'Etat" (CTIE). CTIE is the provider of services, coordination, planning, policy-making and assistance to all governmental bodies.
Principles	E-government, simplification of administrative processes and interoperability are part of the 2009 governmental declaration.
Effectiveness	Assessment of the effectiveness of interoperability initiatives is emerging.

Dimension Interoperability

Political	Legal, organisational and technical dimension of interoperability is part of political discussion up to the prime minister's office.
Legal	No known specific documentation or insight in initiatives available via contact person.
Organisational	Focus for organisational collaboration is rather part of each e-Governance initiative than a separate framework and is foreseen on various areas (G1, G2O, G2G, G2C, G2IG).
Semantic	No known specific documentation or initiative.
Technical	Interoperability on the technical level is less visible as being part of separate initiatives. The CTIE centrally coordinates all IT initiatives and interoperability is achieved due to this central approach. Usage of open standards is part of the policies.

Dimension Services Support

General	Portal function to support interoperability is emerging and part of the information gate of CTIE. A Governmental Network managed by CTIE links all governmental bodies.
Tool Support	European Portals like SEMIC.eu or OSOR.eu are used for inspiration purposes only.
Integration	A meeting for "Correspondants informatiques" of different governmental bodies is organised twice a year.
Security	Office of Personal Data Protection Officer and National Security Authority are in place, National Authority for technical Security of Information Systems will be ready in time with the new EU security regulation.
