Public Participation for water protection:U@Marenostrum

The project is designed as a trial project that explores the strengths and weaknesses of a regional and issue specific approach towards eParticipation. The project aims at supporting citizens and local actors to identify and solve important environmental problems related to the management of water and marine environmental protection in the French Riviera, Valencia and Ionian Islands regions in order to enhance their participation in the environmental legislative and decision making processes. The local decision-makers as well as MPs will be able to ask for the citizens' opinions in order to gather their feedback on a specific policy issue like River Basin Management Plans, Marine Strategy or Coastal Zone Management. At the same time, citizens will be better informed about the EU water and marine environment policies as well as about their national water and marine environmental policies. Thus, they will be able to monitor the implementation of the EU legislation in their country. Furthermore, the project will create a framework for exchange and cooperation between Member States. In this way, the actions in the environmental sector will be made more coherent and the conservation of the marine ecosystems and sustainable water resource management will be supported.

The U@MARENOSTRUM Project will establish an eParticipation platform that will include web-based Public Participation GIS which will capture all information on environmental issues on a geographical map.

Digital Social House Zwijndrecht is an online product catalogue. It comprises all relevant social services and allowances for the citizens of Zwijndrecht. All products are linked to their respective service providers and to themes. Thus the catalogue is adapted to the question-pattern of the end-user.

Digital Social House Zwijndrecht is linked to the catalogue of www.rechtenverkenner.be. This is an initiative of the Flemish regional government and provides information on all social allowances granted by governments of different levels. All relevant products of www.rechtenverkenner.be are synchronised with Digital Social House Zwijndrecht, enriched in its cms and fitted into the thematic structure.

BG: ePayment Gateway for public eServices soon operational 14 April 2009

The Bulgarian "[ePayment Gateway](#)", a single web environment enabling citizens and legal entities to settle online their payments to the central, regional and local Administration, will become fully operational after its final approval by the Bulgarian National Bank at the end of April 2009.

The project was launched in April 2008 and ended on 1 October 2008. Officially entitled "Elaboration of an environment ensuring electronic payments in the process of providing online administrative services", the project is managed by the Ministry of State Administration and Administrative Reform (MSAAR) and funded based on the Operational Programme "Administrative Capacity" (OPAC). The technical implementation was assigned to a Bulgarian software company. The Ministry of Finance coordinates the Guidelines for the Electronic Payment Environment issued by the Bulgarian National Bank and the MSAAR.

The primary aims of the so-called "ePayment Gateway" or "ePayment Environment" project are the following:

- To provide citizens and legal persons with an easy, secure and modern way of performing the electronic payment of taxes, public service fees, fines and other financial obligations towards the Administration, thus ensuring fast access to the services which have been paid for while improving the performance of public service delivery.
- To provide a single connection and an effective communication between different Administrations (at state, regional and municipal levels), banks and payment operators in the country.
- To ensure that all private individuals and legal entities in Bulgaria receive a fast and convenient communication service with all levels of Administration.

The ePayment Gateway is part of the integrated eGovernment system. It will allow its citizens and businesses to pay by electronic means the administrative services they requested online via the Bulgarian eGovernment portal 'egov.bg' and via the regional/local Administration's web pages. The use of the Gateway will require identification by using a Qualified Electronic Signature Certificate.

Benefits for citizens and organizations

- Regardless of the bank they are customers of, they will be able to pay via the Internet their due fees and taxes (by simply using their bank cards or by indicating directly their settlement accounts, or through other payment instruments provided by the banks/operators).
- Direct access to the information on the due fees, back taxes and other financial obligations submitted by the different Administrations in the ePayment Environment.
- eMail notification for outstanding taxes and fees.
- Reference information on the completed payments.
- Option to postpone the payment to a later date.
- Access to one's data and payment history/details which are stored through the ePayment Gateway.

Opportunities for the Administration (central, regional and local levels)

- To gain the technical capacity to electronically convey to citizens/businesses the information on their due taxes, fees and fines.
- To accept electronic payment for any public service it provides.
- To get a real-time, automatic electronic confirmation/notification for each online payment.
- To receive the payments directly to its bank account, without the need to open a special account for that purpose (minimum funds and efforts).
- To have a single technical connection with each bank/operator participating in the ePayment Environment, for real-time information exchange on the payments - until now the various Administrations had to create separate technical connections with each of the banks or operators of the electronic payment system in the country.
- To provide the citizens and the legal persons with the opportunity to choose the bank or operator whereby they can effect the payment, using a bank card or directly from their bank account.
- To have a real-time access to the information pertaining to all online payments.

FI: Online order of the European Health Insurance card 9 April 2009

On 30 March 2009 the Finnish Social Insurance Institution (KELA) announced that as of that date citizens would be able to quickly and easily order the European Health Insurance card online on the Institution's official [website](#).

The European Health Insurance card offers the possibility to benefit of medical care and nursing services in the European Union, the European Economic Area (EEA) countries and Switzerland. The delivery of the card will take from one to two weeks, or, alternatively someone may request the dispatch of the card to the Social Insurance Institution.

The European Health Insurance card is valid for two years and once expired can be renewed automatically by the Social Insurance Institution. The online order of the card is a privilege that belongs only to the persons affiliated to the Finnish Social Security System.

Last year nearly 300 000 cards were issued. This number is expected to grow with the new service in question.

CH: Expatriates in favour of new passports 8 April 2009

Swiss expatriates are in favour of new passports equipped with an electronic chip that contains biometric data.

On 17 May, the Swiss citizens will vote, in a ballot, for or against the decision on the new passports made by the Council of the Swiss Abroad which is, however, in line with the Government, the main centre-right parties and the business community.

Thérèse Meyer-Kaelin, a parliamentarian for the Christian Democratic Party, said "the new passports would make the Swiss travel documents more difficult to forge and ease travel".

The new passport, to be issued in 2010, fulfils a requirement for those countries having signed the Schengen Agreement.

"There are a number of safety measures to protect the databases and prevent abuses," Ms. Meyer-Kaelin continues. She warned that "failure to introduce the new passport could complicate relations between Switzerland and the European Union".

More aspects on this issue were also mentioned, starting with Social Democratic parliamentarian Carlo Sommaruga who highlighted the data protection risks of a central register and pointed out that the Government could even decide to equip identity cards with electronic chips at a later date. "The private sphere has to be respected, citizens must not be treated like criminals," he added. Several speakers in the assembly backed this statement by warning of the increasing interference by the State through databases.

Opponents moreover cautioned against emerging higher costs for the new passport as the authorities plan to reduce the number of application centres. On the contrary, supporters warned that a rejection of the biometric passport would restrict travel.

The assembly overwhelmingly approved a resolution calling on the authorities to ensure that the Swiss abroad will not be discriminated against if passports with electronic chips are introduced. "We expect that every Swiss embassy and regular consulate is equipped with the technical means to record biometric data needed for the passports," said Roberto Engeler, a senior member of the Swiss Abroad Council.

MK: National Information Society Council held first session 8 April 2009

The Ministry of Information Society of the Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia announced that the newly established National Information Society Council held its first constitutive session on 18 March 2009.

The new National Information Society Council aims "to improve IT conditions in the country", the official press release states.

In line with the Government's decision to form the Council and in accordance with the national strategies for Information Society, electronic communications and information technologies, the Council is an independent body comprised of representatives of State institutions, the private sector and civil society, who all participate in the development of the Information Society.

"The National Council is established in order to enable accessible communication amongst all actors in the sphere to give guidelines, suggestions and possible solutions to the Government for Information Society development (...)" Minister of Information Society Ivo Ivanovski told the press the day of the first session.

Minister Ivanovski added that the Council's members will discuss and review projects developed by the Government, which are part of the strategies for IT growth, and put forward measures for improving the conditions for the development of national firms and for attracting foreign investments.

As the Minister pointed out, this first session focused on the current situation, the ongoing projects under the auspices of the Ministry of Information Society and future projects.

MT: Government launches four new eGovernment initiatives 7 April 2009

On 2 April 2009, the Maltese Minister for Information, Transport and Communications (MITC), Austin Gatt, officially announced the launch of three new eGovernment services and an eGovernment Services Directory.

The three services are the [eHealth portal](#), the [online certificates website](#) and the [scholarships service](#).

In the foreword to the [eGovernment Services Directory](#), Minister Gatt writes "We have compiled this e-Government Services Directory to help users look for the e-services they require. The user may consider this directory as a manual and a complete list of the e-government services launched to date. We will continue to update it with every service launched and an updated version will always be available at www.mygov.mt."

Funded by the MITC through the eGovernment Alliance Framework and managed by the Malta Information Technology Agency (MITA), these initiatives are aimed at improving the service delivery channels available between the Government and citizens.

Currently, the Maltese Government offers 70 online services to citizens and businesses. Once the ongoing projects initialised during 2008 are finalised, MITA is planning a new eGovernment framework which will be simpler to use as it will streamline the user interfaces to these services.

The eGovernment 2.0 is also planned to be richer in content, more sophisticated in services and faster to set up. The priority of this new framework will be citizen-centricity, the concept of presenting services and processes focused on the needs of the citizen. According to MITA's press release, the investment on this project will start during 2009 and will span up to 2012.

The ongoing transformation on the Maltese Government's IT resources is merely part of a much larger restructuring programme in the Government's approach to offering public services. MITA continues to fulfil all operations of Malta Information Technology and Training Services Ltd (MITTS Ltd, which was a Government-owned company supplying IT systems and services to Government departments), and took over the functions of the former Information Society Secretariat, ICT in Government Unit and the Core ICT Advisory Committee. The transition from MITTS to MITA is in its final stages following the recent approval of its strategic plan.

Following a recent attempted cyber attack on an embassy's server, Minister Austin Gatt furthermore praised the professional way in which MITA staff managed to neutralise the situation before any damage was done and for the preventive measures taken to ensure minimum impact on services provided to the public.

7th Eastern European eGov Days: eGovernment & eBusiness Ecosystem & eJustice

The annual Eastern European eGov Days provide a solid platform for exchange of creative ideas and inspiring technology transfer between Western and Eastern European countries. The 7th EEEGOV Days will focus on the themes of eGovernment, the eBusiness Ecosystem and eJustice. Supplementing the Czech presidency of the European Union, the event is held under the auspices of the Czech Ministry of the Interior.

The event is organised in cooperation with a wide range of partners from: the national governments of Austria, Latvia, Hungary, Slovakia, and Sweden; the regional government of Vysocina Region (CZ); civic partners such as the Vienna Core group (EU), the Judicial Academy (CZ) and the Respekt Institute (CZ); and business.

- Digital Government & Business Ecosystem: Concepts, models and challenges, Vertical and horizontal integration of services, Economic and financial aspects, Evaluation and measurement of eGovernment, eProcurement, Semantic technologies.
- eJustice: Judicial decisions on-line (data protection/anonymization, accessibility, applications, uniform gateways, semantic search systems etc.), on-line publication of black-letter law, multi-jurisdictional systems, unification of search criteria and search terms, semantic systems etc., IT support of the judiciary, Legal aspects of eGovernment implementation.
- Public Sector Information: Implementation of Directive 2003/98/EC throughout Europe (experience, opinions, outlook), innovative PSI products & packages (business, geographic, meteorology, traffic, socio-economical, legal etc.; accessibility of PSI and its privacy issues, economic issues of PSI, problems and challenges of data holders, the end users' view.

E-Health and Bioengineering Conference (EHB) 2009

The main focus of EHB 2009, the second edition of the EHB conference, is placed on ehealth and bioengineering in general. Its goals are to promote concepts and advanced hardware and software technologies in the emerging domains of ehealth, telemedicine, medical devices/equipment, medical informatics, biomechanics, biomaterials, biotechnologies and healthcare management.

Another objective is to strengthen the interdisciplinary synergy between medical and technical researchers and practitioners, within the generous framework of medical bioengineering, in order to establish and promote advanced scientific concepts, methods and technologies for medical services and healthcare in Romania and enlarged Europe. In this respect, a special attention will be granted in the next years to targeting research to the real needs of patients, through different national and international projects and partnerships.

Last but not least, EHB 2009 represents a new "official" occasion to show that telemedicine in Romania and particularly in Iași exceeds the level of other more or less theoretical approaches and demonstrative issues. Its maturity was already proven by real time transmission and analysis of some vital biosignals of patients, performed by using the facilities offered by the first Romanian Telemedical Regional Centre located at the Faculty of Medical Bioengineering of the „Gr.T. Popa" University of Medicine and Pharmacy in Iași, which was developed by a local team within two research pilot projects - TELMES and TELEMON - financed by the Romanian Ministry of Education and Research.

The intention is therefore to promote procedures for teleconsultation, telediagnosis and telemonitoring, providing an alternative to be employed in the healthcare system that could be made available "every time and anywhere" for those persons who need such a public service.
